Dear Parent or Guardian:

Camp L'man Achai is once again participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all eligible children free of charge. (To be eligible to receive free meals at camp, children must meet the income guidelines for reduced price meals in the National School Lunch Program). Children who are part of households that receive food stamps, or benefits under the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals. The following 2010-2011 income eligibility standards will be used for determining eligibility for free meals:

Meals will be provided at Camp L'man Achai on Perch Lake Road in Andes, New York throughout the summer, from June 16th through September 5th. Breakfast will be served from 9:00-10:45AM, lunch will be served from 1:00-3:00 PM and supper will be served from 6:00-8:00 PM.

A supplement will be served at 5:00pm.

Eligibility has already been established. No further documentation is required.
